


THE AESTHETIC

"ROSE ELEGANCE"







Texture

Texture is used to bring life to this collection, adding lace floral roses to the garments using **surface design**, as well as in the photography—the use of a textured brick road and flowers popping up. Visually, the texture creates a 3-dimensional experience.

Chape

Organic shape brings an important design element in this collection, irregular and curved pieces accenting the body.

Lines

The *actual lines* in garments give the body emphasis in essential areas, adding to the dimension.

Color

The designer uses *neutral* colors of white and black with hints of red to create a classic color scheme. Several of the pieces included were *monochromatic*—meaning they consisted of multiple shades of a single hue.

Emphasis

Certain pieces contain roses and use *contrast emphasis* in order for the floral theme to come through into the clothing.
