THE LITTLE BLACK DRESS

HISTORICAL COLLECTION SCENE

Coco Chanel is often credited with making the little black dress an ever-present style in women's wardrobes. Chanel was in tune with the times; and in the times of the great depression, functionality was the key. The LBD, or little black dress, is the most talked about dress in history and a statement piece that is accessible to women of all socioeconomic backgrounds.

Of course other designers recognized the importance of the garment and used the LBD to carve their own niche. In the 1950s and 1960s designers made it elegant, mod, simple and in some cases extreme. In the 1970s and 1980s incarnations were slinky then structured with accentuated shoulders and volume. In the upcoming JCCC Spring Fashion Show a scene will be dedicated to Chanel's vision of the little black dress.

The Fashion Show will showcase the evolution of the LBD from famous designers such as Pierre Cardin, Yves Saint Laurent, James Galanos, Norman Norell, Pauline Trigere, and Chanel.
